Congratulations to all the winners

More than 700 people gathered at the Westminster Park Plaza to celebrate the 17th annual Charity Times Awards this year. Refuge was among the big winners, crowned the Charity of the Year (income over £10m) for maintaining its dedicated focus on beneficiaries in a very difficult funding environment. Tyne Gateway Trust, a Newcastle-based charity tackling child poverty, was named Charity of the Year (income of less than £1m) for its tight focus on its service users' needs, and Bowel Cancer UK won Charity of the Year (with income between £1m and £10m).
